The nation's top public health physician since October 2007, the Surgeon General communicates the best science, evidence, and data to the American people so they will be able to make healthy choices. Dr. Galson will speak about a number of the health issues facing us today, and he will address the critical role that JCCs can play in their communities in preventing eating disorders and early- childhood obesity, as well as promoting parent—child programs, and youth and teen participation in healthy, supervised activities.
